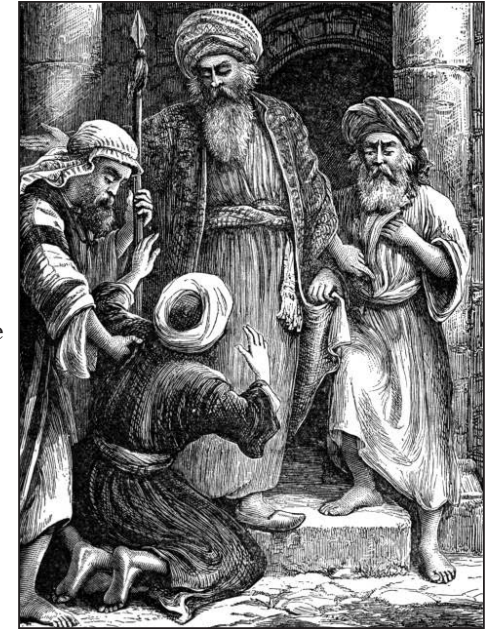

That portion of the divine Word which we have in today's Gospel sums up the whole Christian life in the practice of that virtue of charity which makes us treat our neighbor as almighty God has treated us. He has forgiven us great sins; let us in turn, learn how to forgive our brethren their infinitely less important offenses against us.

The devil in his jealousy drives men to act like the wicked servant who seized by the throat one who owed him a trifling sum and cast him into prison because he could not pay at once. In the day of Judgment, God will treat us as we have treated our neighbor. Of that day this Sunday's Mass warns us in our Lord's words: "The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king who would take account of his servants." At that time of justice pure and simple, He will be merciless like us if, during this life when He is all mercy to us, we have not learned to be merciful like Him. The wicked servant was delivered to the torturers. "So," says our Lord, "shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts."

The executioners to whom we shall be delivered by our Lord in His just anger against us, will be the powers of hell from whom He has protected us on earth, but whom He will then leave to indulge their hatred against us. It is enough to recall their rage against holy Job. Let us be on our guard against them, the more so, that this Sunday reminds us of the time when the devils will use their power against men with greater violence, since they will soon lose it altogether. "O Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God" (Gradual).

Indulgences for the Poor Souls

A plenary indulgence for the Poor Souls in Purgatory may be obtained each day from Nov. 1st-8th. Plenary indulgence means the complete remission of the debt due to sin. To obtain a plenary indulgence for the Holy Souls, one must:

- + Between November 1-8: visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls.
- + Receive communion on the day of the visit.
- + Go to confession 8 days before or after.
- + Offer the Our Father, Hail Mary and Apostles' Creed for the Pope's intentions.
- + Have no attachment to sin, even venial. Partial indulgences obtained otherwise.

Pope Pius XI granted a plenary indulgence toties quoties, applicable to the souls in Purgatory (S. Paen. Ap., 3 Jan. 1939) for those who enter a church...and having received Penance and Holy Communion, say six Our Fathers, Hail Marys, and Glory Bes.

To request a Mass intention, please note the following:

A reminder that the stipend for a Mass is currently \$20. The stipend in no way corresponds with the value of a Mass, which is of infinite value. We ask those who wish to have Masses said to please indicate clearly on a piece of paper their name, the intention of the Mass to be said (including, if applicable, the name of any person(s) for whom the intention is associated) and to put this information and the stipend in an envelope for the priest (celebrant). Also, please indicate whether the person for whom a Mass is intended is deceased or living.

November Poor Souls Envelopes

Envelopes are available at the back of the Church. Write the names of your deceased on the envelope and place it in the collection basket. All envelopes will be placed on the Church altar and remembered at each Mass during the month of November in the Memento pro defunctis. No stipend is required for this act of charity. If you wish to include an offering, your donation will help towards the Church's sacristy expenses.
